Workshop Descriptions

Workshop #1: Healthcare

Violent incidents in healthcare facilities are becoming more common, and it is critical that staff in these facilities are prepared to respond when they occur. In this workshop, a group of experienced healthcare providers and security specialists will discuss the procedures that healthcare providers should have in place to prepare for, mitigate, respond to and recover from a violent attack. The workshop will use a scenario that occurs in a hospital emergency room to demonstrate these points.

Workshop #2: Class A Office Buildings

This workshop will explore the various considerations that security professionals, building management and law enforcement need to keep in mind to prepare for and respond to a workplace violence incident that occurs in a large commercial building. The issues we will discuss include threat assessment, proactive security measures, incident management, liability of building owners/managers and interaction between building managers and first responders. Workshop participants will actively participate in an exercise that examines a realistic workplace violence scenario.

Workshop #3: Educational Institutions

While the scenario used in this workshop may play out differently, both in execution and reaction, in various schools and jurisdictions, there are certain universal elements that are critical to the continuing study of mitigation and response to violence/active shooters. The workshop aims to expand your knowledge of potential threats and vulnerabilities so you may formulate appropriate responses; to provide a new scenario for use in your own game-planning and exercises in your location; and to allow participants to share prior experience, best practices, and other useful information.

Workshop #4: Retail Sector

The purpose of the retail workshop is to understand industry related violence/crime trends on retailers across the country. By measuring trends and operational methods of effective practices, retailers will be better positioned to manage to the threat of industry-wide issues, which has significant repercussions on consumers, businesses, and local economies. The workshop will expand participants' knowledge of potential threats and crime trends so retailers may formulate appropriate responses; provide proactive measures to counter merging threats and provide scenarios for use in training exercises at your businesses /locations; and will allow participants to gain experience, best practices, and other useful direction when dealing with violence in the retail workplace.

Bonnie S. Michelman, CPP, CHPADirector of Police, Security and Outside Services
Massachusetts General Hospital

Bonnie Michelman has extensive leadership and security management experience in diverse industries. She currently is the Director of Police, Security and Outside Services at Massachusetts General Hospital and the Security Consultant for Partners Healthcare Inc. Boston, Massachusetts. She was formerly District Manager at First Security Services overseeing 60 diverse operations and Assistant Vice President for General Services/Operations at Newton Wellesley Hospital managing 16 departments and doing significant leadership work.

Bonnie is Past President (2008 and 1995)/Chairman of the Board of the International Association for Healthcare Security and Safety (IAHSS). Under Bonnie's direction, MGH won the Lindberg Bell Award for the nation's finest healthcare security program in 1999 and 2007 among numerous other awards and recognitions. Bonnie served as President in 2001 of ASIS-International, a 38,000-person organization, Chairman of the Board in 2002, and Foundation President from 2003-2005. She is an Instructor at Northeastern University, College of Criminal Justice in the Graduate and Undergraduate program since 1988. Bonnie is on the Regional Board of Directors for the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) and chairs their National Security Committee. She was appointed in 2010 by DHS Secretary Janet Napolitano to the Homeland Security Advisory Council (HSAC). She has held many leadership positions nationally and internationally. She lectures and consults internationally on areas of workplace violence, hate crimes, domestic violence, risk assessment/management, leadership and communications. She has over 60 publications in various journals on safety, security, leadership and management.

Bonnie has an MBA, an MS in Criminal Justice and a BA in Government and Sociology.
