# **Session Descriptions**

# NSSE and Large-Scale Events: Threats, Security, and Planning

SAIC Baisel and SAC Farley will lead a discussion on how the National Special Security Events Credentialing (NSSE) and large-scale events are handled with regard to threats, security and planning. The session will focus on communication and relationships as the main ingredients to a successful security event as well incorporate the private sector, especially those whose company sponsors parts of the event

#### The 3 C's – Consular, Crisis and Contacts

Building contacts ahead of big events such as the World Cup or the Olympics is common sense, but what about during normal times? Have you ever wondered what an Embassy or Consulate does? Have you ever wondered what a Foreign National does when they need assistance overseas? Atlanta is an International City with over 60 countries represented. A general overview of how the Consular Services, in normal times and in crisis, engages with law enforcement and emergency management.

# Preparing the City

The City of Atlanta is overseeing public safety and security planning, preparedness, and operations for the upcoming 2026 FIFA World Cup. Robust interagency collaboration, private sector partnerships, cross-functional coordination, and advanced technology integration are central to this effort. The objective is to safeguard all stakeholders while maintaining seamless event and business operations through organic and systematic safety and security measures and contingency planning.

# Special Event Emergency Preparedness

This presentation provides public safety personnel and event planning staff with information related to pre-event planning, forming the planning team, event hazard analysis, risk assessments, and responding to incidents during special events in their community.

Learning Objectives: After the Panel Discussion, attendees will be able to:

- Define special events.
- Identify special event planning team members.
- Conduct a hazard analysis and risk assessment for a special event.
- Utilize the Incident Command System (ICS) during each phase (planning, execution, and demobilization) of your special event.

# Human Trafficking

Rooted in the foundational pillars and priorities of the interagency National Action Plan to Combat Human Trafficking, which President Biden released on Dec. 3, 2021, the Justice Department's National Strategy is expansive in scope. It aims to enhance the department's capacity to prevent human trafficking; to prosecute human trafficking cases; and to support and protect human trafficking victims and survivors. Strengthen engagement, coordination, and joint efforts to combat human

trafficking by prosecutors in all 94 U.S. Attorneys' Offices and by federal law enforcement agents nationwide.

Establish federally funded, locally led anti-human trafficking task forces that support sustained state law enforcement leadership and comprehensive victim assistance. Step up departmental efforts to end forced labor by increasing attention, resources and coordination in labor trafficking investigations and prosecutions. Enhance initiatives to reduce vulnerability of American Indians and Alaska Natives to violent crime, including human trafficking, and to locate missing children. Develop and implement new victim screening protocols to identify potential human trafficking victims during law enforcement operations and encourage victims to share important information.

# Working with Security Teams

Given the level of "passion" surrounding the international sport of "football" and the increased pressure brought to bear by playoffs, it will be no surprise that numerous people including team owners, coaches, players, and many wealthy fans will opt for personal safety in the form of public or private protective personnel or teams. As Atlanta will be the host for the 2026 FIFA World Cup, we are certain to see a number of these security teams in our city. Of these, though, how many are officially sanctioned and/or licensed, and how many are, at best, "unofficial?" How do we recognize one from the other and how do we coordinate, if at all, with these teams? Learning Objectives: After the Panel Discussion, attendees will be able to:

- Recognize the difference between a credentialed security team and a loose gang of "armed muscle."
- Communicate and coordinate with the credentialed security team.
- Coordinate with, but monitor and/or contain, the "unofficial" security team.
- Facilitate the communication and interaction of two foreign-national teams that are meeting for the first time.
- Better understand some of the Georgia laws affecting both public sector and private sector security.

# Interoperable Communication

Creating a region-wide public safety radio network comes with a number of challenges, including disparate spectrum, LMR systems from different vendors, and the need to support multiple admins as well as local control requirements. This presentation will discuss how cloud interoperability makes creating a system of systems possible by providing the interoperability framework needed for agencies to share and control resources. The resulting virtual network allows public safety to communicate seamlessly across jurisdictional boundaries.

#### SCOTT ASHWORTH

Scott started his career in law enforcement, spending nearly a decade serving communities of metro Atlanta. He left full-time law enforcement as a Lieutenant over investigations with the Forest Park Police Department to begin a new path in sports security.

In 2017, he joined Atlanta United FC of the MLS to head up the organization's security efforts including the

protection of a state-of-the-art 60 million dollar training center. Scott worked closely with the other experienced leaders at AMB Sports and Entertainment to mature Atlanta United's security operation into a world-class program.

Joining another skyrocketing sports brand in 2021, Scott took on the role of Head of Safety and Security for Overtime Elite. He was responsible for overseeing the creation of security programming for the new league, prioritizing protecting Overtime's players, staff, fans, facilities, and assets. The Overtime Elite League consists of six teams comprised of seventy top basketball prospects from around the world playing in several venues across four states in front of seventy-million followers through social media and live streaming on Amazon Prime worldwide.



#### STEVEN BAISEL

Steven R. Baisel is a Senior Executive (SES) and federal law enforcement special agent with 27 years of experience with the U.S. Secret Service, focusing equally on both the protective and investigative responsibilities of the agency.

In December 2019, Mr. Baisel assumed responsibilities as the Special Agent in Charge of the Atlanta Field Office, responsible for overseeing all mission related investigations, protective intelligence and protective visits in the state of

Georgia. In addition to his leadership role, Mr. Baisel is also a certified executive coach.

Prior to his SES appointment, Mr. Baisel was the Special Agent in Charge, Inspections Division, Headquarters, where he was responsible for all of the agency's Integrity investigations and Office Compliance Audits. Mr. Baisel held leadership responsibilities while on the Vice-President's Protective Division and in the New York Field Office.

Prior to starting his Secret Service career 26 years ago, Mr. Baisel was a police officer in west Michigan. He graduated from Michigan State University with a Bachelor's degree in Accounting.



#### RYAN BUCHANAN

Ryan K. Buchanan is the U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia. Mr. Buchanan was nominated by President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. on November 15, 2021, and confirmed by the U.S. Senate confirmed his nomination on April 27, 2022.

As the chief federal law enforcement official in the Northern District of Georgia, U.S. Attorney Buchanan

oversees the investigation and litigation of all criminal and civil cases brought in the district on behalf of the United States. He leads an office of approximately 250 prosecutors, civil litigators, and support personnel in its mission to enforce federal criminal law, advocate for the victims of crimes, and represent the United States' interests in federal court – including in matters involving domestic and international terrorism, organized crime, gang violence, public corruption, cybercrime, narcotics trafficking, civil rights violations, whistleblower actions, and financial and healthcare fraud. The district serves over seven million people.

Mr. Buchanan serves on the Attorney General's Advisory Committee (AGAC), a select group of United States Attorneys who advise the Attorney General on matters of policy, procedure, and management. Specifically, Mr. Buchanan serves as Vice-Chair of the AGAC's Terrorism and National Security Subcommittee and leads the Foreign Influence and Nation-State Threats Working Group. Mr. Buchanan also serves on the AGAC's Office, Management, and Budget Subcommittee.

Mr. Buchanan joined the Department of Justice in 2010. From 2010 to 2013, Mr. Buchanan served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Northern District of Alabama. Since 2013, he has served as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Northern District of Georgia, where he has also served as the National Security and Anti-Terrorism Council Coordinator and as Deputy Chief of the Violent Crime and National Security Section.

As a federal prosecutor, Buchanan has prosecuted cases involving the support of foreign terrorist organizations and attempts by would-be domestic terrorists to acquire weapons of mass destruction. He has also prosecuted and supervised cases involving violent crimes such as armed robbery, kidnapping, and carjacking; crimes involving the exploitation of children via child pornography production and distribution; and organized crime cases involving national gangs.

Prior to joining the Department of Justice, Mr. Buchanan was in private practice at McGuireWoods LLP. He also served as a law clerk to Judge Inge P. Johnson of

the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Alabama. Mr. Buchanan received his J.D. from Vanderbilt University Law School in 2005 and his B.S. from Samford University in 2001.



#### W. LARRY DAVIS

W. Larry Davis has been involved in the area of investigation and security for the past thirty-eight years. He served in a law enforcement capacity with the United States Marine Corps where he worked as a Shore Patrol Officer, Marine Chaser, and Military Police Investigator assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division. He later served as a hand-to-hand combat instructor and was recruited into the Protective Services Branch where he served as the close protection agent assigned to protect the lives of high-

ranking officers, and dignitaries throughout the world.

Davis is a certified private investigator having been licensed in the State of Georgia since 1984. He is also licensed in the State of Alabama. Davis devotes most of his time to providing protective services to celebrities, professional athletes, and corporate executives. He has worked on numerous feature film and television productions to provide cast and overall production security. Through his connections within the Georgia Film Commission community he is also available to assist with permits and coordination of local law enforcement for traffic control and additional security on set. Davis is a tactics and firearm expert and can also provide assistance with technical advisement in those areas as well as for insight on the job of an investigator in the public or private sector.

Mr. Davis holds several advanced degrees in the field of Martial Arts, having been involved in the study for over forty years. He holds the rank of 3rd degree Black Belt in the Art of Hwarang Do. He holds a 2nd degree Black Belt in the Art of Hapkido, and Tang Soo Do. He also holds advanced degrees in Chinese Kenpo, Aikido and Iaido. Mr. Davis served as a hand-to-hand combat instructor for the Military Police divisions, Marine Force Recon Units, and the Navy SEALS. He is active in providing instruction to security, law enforcement, and corrections personnel in defensive tactics, handcuffing, knife defense, and the use of an expandable baton.

Mr. Davis has received extensive training in executive protection from numerous facilities including U.S. Marine Protection Services Training, Marine Corps Embassy Guard, U.S. Secret Service, Executive Security International, NIA, Institute of Public Service, Blackwater, BSR, and the Executive Protections Institute. Mr. Davis has served as the personal protection agent for numerous high-profile celebrities, Fortune 500 executives, and political figures, and authors. He is recognized as an expert in close protection by several national and international organizations.

In addition to providing cast security services, Mr. Davis has also provided personal security services to a number of professional athletes and members of the U.S.

Olympic Teams. Davis has provided protective services training for law enforcement and local security personal regarding terrorist tactics and overall protection protocols for the Olympic Games at various venues for the games including Los Angeles, Calgary, Barcelona, Atlanta, Sydney, Salt Lake City, London, and Rio de Janeiro. He has provided protective services at the games for celebrities, professional athletes, and corporate executives attending the games.

Davis has provided protective services to players in the NBA, NFL, MLB, NHL, Women's Tennis Association (WTA), U.S. Tennis Association (USTA), as well as a number of minor league organizations.

#### FELIPE DEN BROK



Felipe den Brok brings an extensive 33-year background in Law Enforcement and Emergency Preparedness, spanning both the public and private sectors. His experience includes a tenure with the Federal Bureau of Investigation, complemented by his previous service as a sworn officer with the Atlanta Police Department.

During his time as a Supervisory Special Agent with the Critical Incident Response Group (CIRG), Felipe focused

on security and crisis management efforts along the East Coast of the United States. He participated in operational deployments to significant events, including the Winter Olympic Games in PyeongChang, Korea (2018), Super Bowl LII in Minneapolis (2018), College Football National Championship in Atlanta (2017), the U.S. Presidential Inauguration (2017), the North Dakota standoff (2016), the UN General Assembly in NYC (2016-2017), the Orlando Pulse nightclub shooting (2016), the Malheur Wildlife Refugee standoff (2016), and the Pan-Am Games (2015). His role in these events showcased his expertise in areas such as liaison officer (LNO), Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD), Crisis Management, and Special Events management.

Following his retirement from the FBI, Felipe transitioned to a role as an Emergency Preparedness and Response Analyst with Equifax's Crisis Management Team. In this capacity, he assumed responsibility for developing, implementing, and maintaining global Crisis Management and Business Continuity plans.

Currently, Felipe serves as the Executive Director of the Mayor's Office of Emergency Preparedness (MOEP) for the City of Atlanta. MOEP plays a pivotal role in facilitating cross-organizational coordination for preparedness and response planning, as well as supporting collaborative responses to emergencies and large planned events. In his leadership capacity, Felipe also heads the FWC26 Coordination Team and oversees initiatives related to critical infrastructure security and the city's Emergency Management.



#### KERI FARLEY

Special Agent in Charge Keri Farley began her career as a Special Agent (SA) in 2004. She was first assigned to the Boston Field Office where she investigated a wide variety of National Security matters.

In 2007, she transferred to the New York City Field Office and in 2010, was promoted to Supervisory Special Agent

(SSA) where she oversaw New York's first Terrorist Use of the Internet squad.

She became SSA of the Long Island Resident Agency's Joint Terrorist Task Force in 2012 and was subsequently appointed as Assistant Inspector/Team Leader in the Inspection Division at FBIHQ in 2014. In 2016, she was selected as an Assistant Special Agent in Charge in the Charlotte Division, and in 2018, was promoted to Section Chief in the Counterterrorism Division, FBIHQ. SAC Farley finished her time at FBIHQ serving as the Chief of Staff for the Executive Assistant Director in the National Security Branch.

In May of 2022, SAC Farley reported to the Atlanta Field Office, where she is currently the Special Agent in Charge.

Prior to joining the FBI, she played handball for the United States National Handball Team as well as practiced labor and employment law. She received her Bachelor's Degree from Cornell University in 1995 where she also played basketball for the Big Red. She received her Juris Doctorate Degree from Emory University School of Law in 1998.



# <u>JEANET FRANKLIN</u>

Detective Jeanet Franklin is a 14-year veteran with the Atlanta Police Department. Her career with the Atlanta Police Department started in Zone Six as a patrol man. During her duration with the Atlanta Police Department, she has worked in several assignments that groomed her for her current role as a detective. She is currently assigned to the Special Victims Unit/ Child Exploitation Operation Protection Squad. In this role she investigates, Human Traf-

ficking, Cyber Sexual Exploitation. Along with this role she also investigates, adult sex crimes, child abuse and child exploitation crimes. She is also a member of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Task Force for Child Exploitation / Human Trafficking, where this allows her the ability to investigate and charge Federal Human Trafficking case on a federal level.



#### **ROBBIE FRIEDMANN**

Dr. Robert R. Friedmann is director of the Georgia International Law Enforcement Exchange and Professor Emeritus of Criminal Justice at Georgia State University's Andrew Young School of Policy Studies. He was the Distinguished Chair of Public Safety Partnerships (2007-2010) and served as Chair (1989-2002) of the Criminal Justice Department at Georgia State University. Dr. Friedmann received his B.S. (Sociology and Anthropology, and Philosophy) from the

University of Haifa, Israel (1974); his M.A. and Ph.D. (Sociology) from the University of Minnesota (1978); and his M.S.S.W. (Social Work) from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1981).

His interest and published work focus on community policing, terrorism, and crime analysis. His books include: Community Policing: Comparative Perspectives and Prospects, (1992), Criminal Justice in Israel: An Annotated Bibliography of English Language Publications, 1948-1993 (1995), Crime and Criminal Justice in Israel: Assessing the Knowledge Base toward the Twenty-First Century (1998), A Diary of Four Years of Terrorism and Anti-Semitism: 2000-2004 (2005; two volumes), and 28 Letters (2012). He also authored numerous articles and research reports on crime

Dr. Friedmann chaired the Georgia Commission to Assess State Crime Laboratory Needs into the 21st Century; he is a Member of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police (GACP), and a Member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) and its Community Policing Committee. He assisted in security planning and preparation for the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, for the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, for the 2012 Olympic Games in London, and for the G-8 in Sea Island, Georgia. He served as a member of the Fulton County Court House Security Commission and he serves on the advisory board of the International Institute for Counter-Terrorism, Herzliya, Israel, the Research Institute for European and American Studies, Athens, Greece, and is a member of the executive committee of The International Counter-Terrorism Academic Community.

Dr. Friedmann works closely with a number of police departments, in the U.S. and internationally, on community policing and homeland security.



#### GARY GLEMBOSKI

Gary J. Glemboski retired after 43 years in law enforcement in 2022. He was in the Marine Corps from 1971-75 and served in the U.S. Army Reserve, 11th Special Forced Group. He was a SWAT officer for over 25 years and team commander for twelve years. From 1994-96, he was responsible for security during the 1996 Olympics in Savannah, GA coordinating the security function with numerous federal, state, and local agencies and local groups.

Gary has earned a graduate degree in Public Administration, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy (Quantico, VA) and the Georgia Law Enforcement Command College. He is a nationally registered EMT-I (NREMT-I), TECC Instructor and codeveloper of a nationally recognized Tactical Medic training course. He has authored several magazine and newspaper articles and training manuals and has been published in the FBI Bulletin, FBINAA Newsletter, Police Marksman magazine, SWAT Magazine, The Firearms Instructor, Armed Lifestyle Magazine, and Law & Order magazine. He is an active firearms and personal protection instructor, a member and past Chapter Chairman for ASIS, a Certified Anti-Terrorism Specialist and is a member of the Georgia Medical Reserve Corps, MAG-MRC.



#### PAUL GUERRUCCI

Paul Guerrucci oversees Georgia World Congress Center Authority's Department of Public Safety, responsible for campus police and security, as well as off-duty police deployment and all inter-agency coordination. An Atlanta area native, he has 20 years of service with the Atlanta Police Department (APD) in a variety of roles, rising through the ranks to his most recent post as assistant commander of the department's Hartsfield-Jackson International Air-

port section. He was named APD's Police Officer of the Year in 1999. He also served as interim director of the Atlanta Police Academy in 2015.

Guerrucci is a graduate of the FBI National Academy. He holds a master's degree in Public Safety Leadership from Mercer University-Atlanta and a Bachelor of Arts in Organizational Leadership, also from Mercer University-Atlanta.



# BRENT KOHMAN

Brent Kohman leads development and execution for Critical Connect and WAVE PTX Public Safety offerings at Motorola Solutions. #### **TRACY LEWIS**

Investigator Tracy Lewis is a 23-year veteran with the City of Atlanta Police Department. Her career began as uniform patrol officer, where she served eight years and received numerous commendations for her work in the field. During her tenure with the Atlanta Police Department, she has worked in several departments; including assistant to a Deputy Chief of the Criminal Investigations Division and in the Staff Inspections Unit (which is tasked with ensuring depart-

mental policies and procedures complied with the standards set by CALEA.

In December 2009, Investigator Lewis was appointed to the position of Investigator. Her investigative career began in Zone Six investigating larceny cases. In 2010, she was reassigned to the Special Victims Unit were investigated Adult Sex Crimes, Child Abuse/Exploitation cases and Runaways. She then progressed to the Homicide Unit, accomplishing her dream job.

Investigator Lewis has also appeared in the reality television series on the A&E Channel the First 48 and TV One's Atlanta Homicide. She also is assigned to the Atlanta Police Hostage Negotiators Unit as a negotiator.

In January 2020, she returned to the Atlanta Police Special Victims Unit where she is a apart of the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Squad (CEOPS) and FBI CSEC Taskforce, where she investigates cases of victims of sexual servitude, cybersex crimes/CSAM and other sexual based crimes against children.



#### **CLAIRE NEWMAN-SMITH**

Claire as Head of British Consular Services at the British Consulate General, Atlanta is charged with assisting British nationals who reside or are visiting six South-eastern States (AL, GA, MS, NC, SC,TN) as well as being responsible for outreach to the wider British community. Claire's 30+ years of consular experience has ranged from human trafficking, death penalty cases, murder/manslaughter, drugs, high level fraud, road traffic accidents including fatalities, and child abduction cases.

Claire is the Consular expert on crisis planning, emergency response, and security issues, and liaises with local, state and federal law-enforcement, public safety and emergency response agencies throughout the region. Claire is a Deputy Team leader of the FCDO Rapid Deployment Team (RDT) for the Americas Region and deployed Sharm El Sheik, Egypt, Las Vegas for the Grand Canyon helicopter incident and in the wake of hurricanes (Katrina to Irma). She most recently was in involved in the Titan Submersible incident.

Claire's personal dedication to public safety afforded her the opportunity to join the Board of the Georgia International Law Enforcement Exchange (GILEE) in 2013.

Claire is a Mental Health First Aider as well as a Designated Safeguarding Officer for the FCDO. Claire has trained in Rape and Sexual Assault, Critical Incident Stress Management and Crisis Responses and Intervention. Annalise has spoken at community events on sex trafficking and child

exploitation, has guest lectured at Emory Law School, and has presented at CLE events on appellate advocacy, prosecutorial ethics, and child exploitation offenses.

Before joining the U.S. Attorney's Office in 2018, Annalise was a litigation and trial practice associate at Alston & Bird LLP in Atlanta. Sheriff Reynolds currently serves as the Sheriff of Cherokee County since 2017. He previously was the Captain of Pickens Sheriff's Office from 2008-2016, a patrol officer at Acworth Police Department, worked at the Department of State, WPPS HTP, IC BWUSA, from 2005-2008 and was a Watch Commander at the Cherokee Sheriff's Office from 1994-2005.

Sheriff Reynolds received a bachelor's degree from Reinhardt University and went on to receive a Master of Public Administration and Justice Administration from Columbus State University. He subsequently graduated from the Riverside Military Academy in Gainesville, Ga.
